PBC and Osteoporosis

Summary

Osteoporosis is a complication frequently observed in patients who have PBC. The pathogenesis of osteoporosis is characterized mainly by low bone formation, although increased bone resorption also is described, especially in cholestatic women who have advanced liver disease.

Osteoporosis is associated with severity of liver disease, older age, and the duration of cholestasis. Patients who have osteoporosis and those who have a lumbar T score below -1.5 have a high risk for fractures, particularly at the spine.

For the prevention and treatment of osteoporosis, good nutrition is advisable, as are the suppression of other risk factors for osteoporosis and the administration of supplements of calcium and vitamin D.

There is no specific treatment for osteoporosis, although it has been demonstrated that bisphosphonates, especially alendronate, are effective in increasing bone mass.

The outcome in reducing the incidence of fractures has not been demonstrated adequately because of the low numbers of patients included in the therapeutic trials.

Hormone treatment has been suggested, although, at present, this indication is questioned, even in patients who do not have liver disease because of potential severe long-term adverse effects.

The potential of bisphosphonates used with only one infusion per year or the efficacy of newer agents now prescribed in patients who are at high risk for developing fractures needs further evaluation in patients who have PBC.
